ARHAG houses refugees and migrants from Africa, and people from the Indian sub-continent, Central and Latin America, the Middle East and Asia. It manages over 700 homes across 13 London



boroughs, including one supported housing scheme for people with learning difficulties.

In 2012, ARHAG ran an innovative project which combined training and support for residents with the opportunity to win a cleaning contract to deliver services directly to the housing association.

In 2000, it joined Shepherds Bush Housing Group and has grown to encompass a wide range of innovative services including; a home improvement agency, furniture re-use, housing advice, benefits & debt advice, small repairs and a community health project.



Many of the strongest community initiatives have an enterprise or employment as a key element of the design. In this session we hear from some of the founders of these ground breaking projects. Bow Arts' mission is to support community renewal in East London by delivering Arts and Creative Services through a financially sustainable social enterprise model.

Bow Arts operates artistic spaces across six sites incorporating a live/work scheme that currently houses 100 artists across 8 properties. In addition they also manage an online artist studio finder and the London's Artist Quarter which acts as a showcase for artists' work.
